You must submit your code using Autolab; your code must be submitted in a single .java file.

Your actual grade may be lower or higher than the grade awarded by Autolab. In other words, you may get partial credit even if your code fails all of the official tests and you may not get full credit even if your code passes all of the official tests.

Your last submission is the one that will be graded. No limit will be placed on the number of submissions but, obviously, you must complete the exam during the lab period and submissions waste time. Autolab will not provide hints.

SUGGESTIONS:

- 1. Submit after completing each method. You will not get credit for code that has not been submitted.
- 2. Test locally before submitting to Autolab.
